FOOD PANTRY

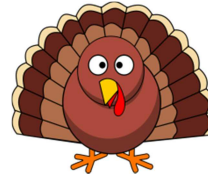
The Johnstown - Northridge Area Food Pantry is an independent not-for-profit organization. From the beginning, the guiding principal for the Food Pantry is helping our own. This thought still guides the program. All support comes from churches, organizations, schools, business, and individuals. There is no association with any Food Banks.

To receive a monthly basket from the Food Pantry, clients must be a resident of either the Johnstown-Monroe or Northridge School District. Yearly, both school systems hold food drives which are very successful. Our church, the Presbyterian Church of Johnstown, considers the Food Pantry to be one of our local missions.

We, as a church, supply non-perishable food items and monetary donations. Our Suds Trilogy provided soap, shampoo, and dishwashing liquid. A donation basket is always in the hallway. Recently, we supplied salad dressing and stuffing mix for the Thanksgiving Food Baskets. Besides the special request drives, we Presbyterians give items to the Pantry on a monthly basis. The Pantry is always grateful.
