SERMON NOTES – 1 Corinthians 9:23-27 & 10:11-13 (NIV)

Responding to Grace: Endurance in our faith is ...

1. *Motivated by the Gospel*

"I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings." (v 23)

2. *Manifested Internally*

"Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training." (v 25a)

3. *Messy in Real Life*

"So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall! No temptation has seized you except what is common to man." (vv 12-13a)
