SERMON NOTES – Jonah 3:1-10 (NIV)

God's Call...

1. *Involves Being Heroic*

"Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a very important city - a visit required three days." (v 3)

2. *Takes Us Out of Our Comfort Zones*

"Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: 'Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim the message I give you.'" (v 1-2)

3. *Reveals His Power and Glory*

"When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he had compassion and did not bring upon them the destruction he had threatened." (v 10)
